"**BONNEVILLE, LAKE**, inland sea of the prehistoric Pleistocene epoch, covering the NW part of present-day Utah. Geologists believe that the **lake** was formed about 50,000 years ago and lasted about 25,000 years. It was about 560 km (about 350 mi) long and 240 km (150 mi) wide, had a maximum depth of more than 305 m (1000 ft), and was more than 1525 m (5000 ft) above sea level. As a result of climatic changes or volcanic disturbances, the **lake** fell below the lowest outlet. When the water evaporated, an arid depression, known as the Great Salt **Lake** Desert, and a remnant, Great Salt **Lake**, were left.
