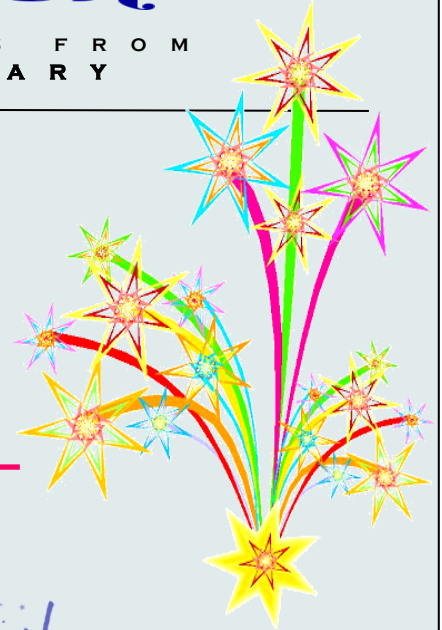

The Book of Lost Names

When Eva, a young Jewish woman, witnesses the Nazis arresting her father, she tries to flee Paris to relocate in Switzerland. Instead, she is asked to use her artistic talents to create new identities and needed papers to help hundreds of Jewish children cross the border to safety. Hidden within the pages of a Catholic text is a code containing all the names of those Eva helped to freedom, as well as an important message for a fellow forger, Remy. Sixty-five years since the war, the book has been rediscovered and Eva wants it back. Based on a true story, this riveting work of historical fiction is highly recommended, especially to those who enjoy books about WWII.

Librarians will help you fulfill each of the categories with book displays and social media videos throughout the year.
