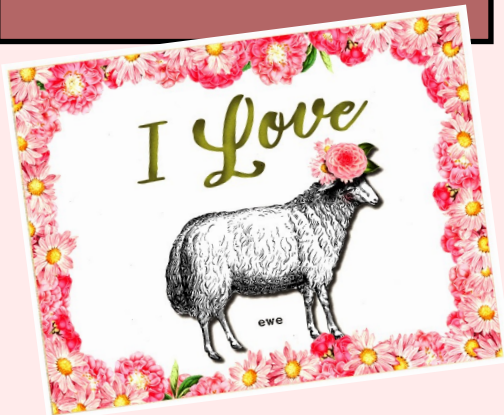

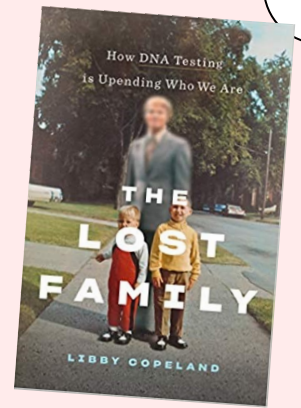
**THE LOST FAMILY: How DNA Testing is Uncovering Secrets, Reuniting Relatives, and Upending Who We Are**

This is a must-read for anyone considering DNA testing for genealogy or health purposes. The story begins slowly but soon turns riveting; Copeland conveys her ideas and research findings in an objective, accessible narrative that does not read at all like non-fiction. To convey the emotional and ethical ramifications of her research, Copeland follows a family for whom DNA testing forever affects their lives. Rather than trying to persuade, she simply presents evidence, allowing readers to make informed decisions regarding whether to be tested and by which companies. Highly recommended!
