Throughout May, MPL will feature unique rock paintings by wounded veterans' advocate Cpl. Miguel Dominic, ARNC.

On June 30, 2005, Cpl. Dominic was nearly killed by an IED outside of Kirkuk, Iraq. He returned home to Pocatello, and, on June 20, 2008, was awarded the Purple Heart.

The father of three now uses small, precise brushes & acrylic paint to bring realistic figures to life. He then applies a thin layer of clear resin to preserve his one-of-a-kind art. Dominic hopes to inspire veterans & others to find similar positive outlets for expression.


At last year's Bannock County Veterans Day ceremony, Dominic said, "Our veterans have protected our country and its values. They did this by putting their lives on the line every day... whether or not their efforts were appreciated..."



Just when you think everything has been written about WWII, along comes a book that reveals another dark side of the Holocaust tragedy. *Born Survivors* focuses on three young women who gave birth while in the Auschwitz II-Birkenau death camp. Author Wendy Holden reveals a story that is both gripping and ghastly. The three young women had to conceal their pregnancies and survive extreme conditions in order to give their children a chance at life. This must have been a difficult book for Holden to have written. Much research and attention to detail went into the preparation of this brutal story. Any lover of historical literature should read this amazing, inspirational account of three very strong women who defied death so their children could live. — TW


