


## 2022 Marshall Public Library Summer Reading - Preschool



The goal is to read (or be read to) every day this summer; 5 minutes or 5 hours it is up to you. The program runs June 5 through August 13. Reading logs are due by Saturday, August 20th. You can use the paper reading log or use the Beanstack App to track your reading days and completed activities. For each day you read, you get to color in a section of the paper log.
