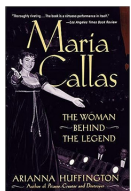

From The Stacks: *Maria Callas: The Woman Behind the Legend* by Arianna Huffington

Dec. 2, 2023 marks the 100th birthday of legendary opera singer, Maria Callas. Originally published in 1981, this book remains overall the best of the many Callas biographies. Huffington's portrait draws from contemporary news reports and interviews with the singer, as well as friends and fellow performers who knew Callas well. As with all portraits, Huffington interprets the facts of Callas' life with some artistic license, engaging in speculation regarding the star's motives and feelings, but she never strays too far from her sources. Callas' meteoric rise to fame, her unforgettable stage triumphs, and her tragic relationship with Aristotle Onassis are related in compelling prose that will keep lovers of a good biography turning pages to the end.
